- Hold a Deferred Standard Diploma or Certificate of Completion with a current IEP (Individualized Educational Plan)
- On-Site Observation to Determine*:
 - o Social Communication Needs
 - Work Maturity Skills
 - o Independence Level
 - Desire & Willingness for Increased Independence in the areas of Employment, Community
 - Living & Independent Adult Living
 *(On-Site Observation includes classroom and/ or community observation, student interview, review of records, current school staff input & family input)

Course Content:

The ACCESS program is a structured work study program with a focus on building the independent skills needed for employment, community living and independent adult living. This program provides students with a variety of job training opportunities that will allow them to determine their strengths, interest and needs. Through the use of self-determination skills and in collaboration with staff, families, agencies and employers, students create an individualized transition plan that will assist them in reaching their goal of greater independence within the adult world.
