- 3. Director's Update Neeta Rancourt- Construction is still in progress as a result of the Smart Bond. Building 3 construction will start and remain through the Summer. Five restrooms will be renovated. The PA and fire systems on Banks Road will be connected to the rest of the campus. The ATC school clinic will be constructed. There is also a parking lot project planned to expand availability for students, visitors, and staff.
- 4. FY25 Atlantic Technical College and Technical Budget—Neeto Rancourt ATC has a balanced budget and enrollment is favorable for the 2024-25 school year. Funding is based on enrollment. The funding increased by twenty-three in FTE (high school). Adult FTE grew by three hundred. There is growth in adult general education (ESOL) and in apprenticeship. There is growth in many areas. Increased to two million dollars in funding. Atlantic Technical College's budget is \$37 million. There is a large increase in the number of Social Studies instructors based on the newly required Financial Literacy course. Special Programs staff increased in the number of instructors and job coaches. The School Accountability Funds have not been received since fiscal year 2021. Unspent funds carried over to the subsequent years. School Recognition Funds (A+ Funds) process will begin in October 2024. Atlantic Technical College has not experienced decline in funding and remains in good standing.

Current school data: Completion Rate 78% Placement Rate 89% Licensure Rate 93%. The percentages represent the 2021-22 school year as data is reported two years in arrears.

- 9. COE Rebecca Miller The COE team will visit the September/October 2024. There are ten standards under review for the visit, each with required written plans. To remain in good standing, the accrediting agency requires the following metric: Placement (70%), Completion (70%), and Licensure (60%). The written plans are currently under review. Ms. Miller provided a brief overview of the standards.
- 10. Media Center Collection Development Policy Cathy Castelli Each school is required to have the plan on the website. Collection Analysis requirements: Minimum of six thousand books, cannot have more than 50% of collection older than fifteen years. ATC meets the requirement. In addition, the Media Center has a diverse collection of materials. A new thesaurus is needed along with non-fiction books and AP Spanish novels.
- 11. School Wide Behavior Rlan Monique Litthcut ROAR (Ready to Work, On Time, Attentive, Responsible) is in place to reward students for good behavior. A review was provided of the uniform policy with forbids baggy jeans with large holes or slits. An Honor Code Violation process if also in place.

 - a. Alexa Horodecki-Irish for a Day event, Staff Appreciation (Bees for a Week), provided a gift for Ms.


 Stark, planned the baby shower for Jamie Enlow.

- competition in Chicago. The Court Reporting program completed the NCRA accreditation process. Two adult students from the Central Sterile Processing Technician program were recognized for performing CPR on a Walmart customer. A graduation ceremony was held for the TIE students. Publix staff met one of the TIE program graduates who has now been hired.
- c. Tammy Clabo Plumbing program will welcome the first class in August. The ESOL program has expanded to daytime classes on the Main Campus.


