- 4. Utilize assessment skills to collect client data using a standardized tool and identifies and reports deviations from normal.
- 5. Demonstrate the ability to provide quality care and the rationale for decisions that promote the health and safety of patients.
- 6. Use evidence-based practice to deliver optimal nursing care that reflects sound decision making and quality improvement consistent with the LPN Scope of Practice.
- 7. Practice within the values, framework, and legal parameters of the Licensed Practical Nurse defined by the Florida Board of Nursing.

PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- 1. Performance of licensure examination
 - a. The PN program will achieve NCLEX PN pass rates at 80 % or above.
- 2. Program completion
 - b. The program will have at least 70% of its current students graduate within one from admission.
- 3. Job Placement
 - c. Sixty percent or more of the students will successfully have placement within nine-twelve months after graduation.



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
